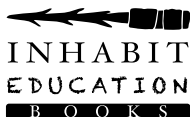

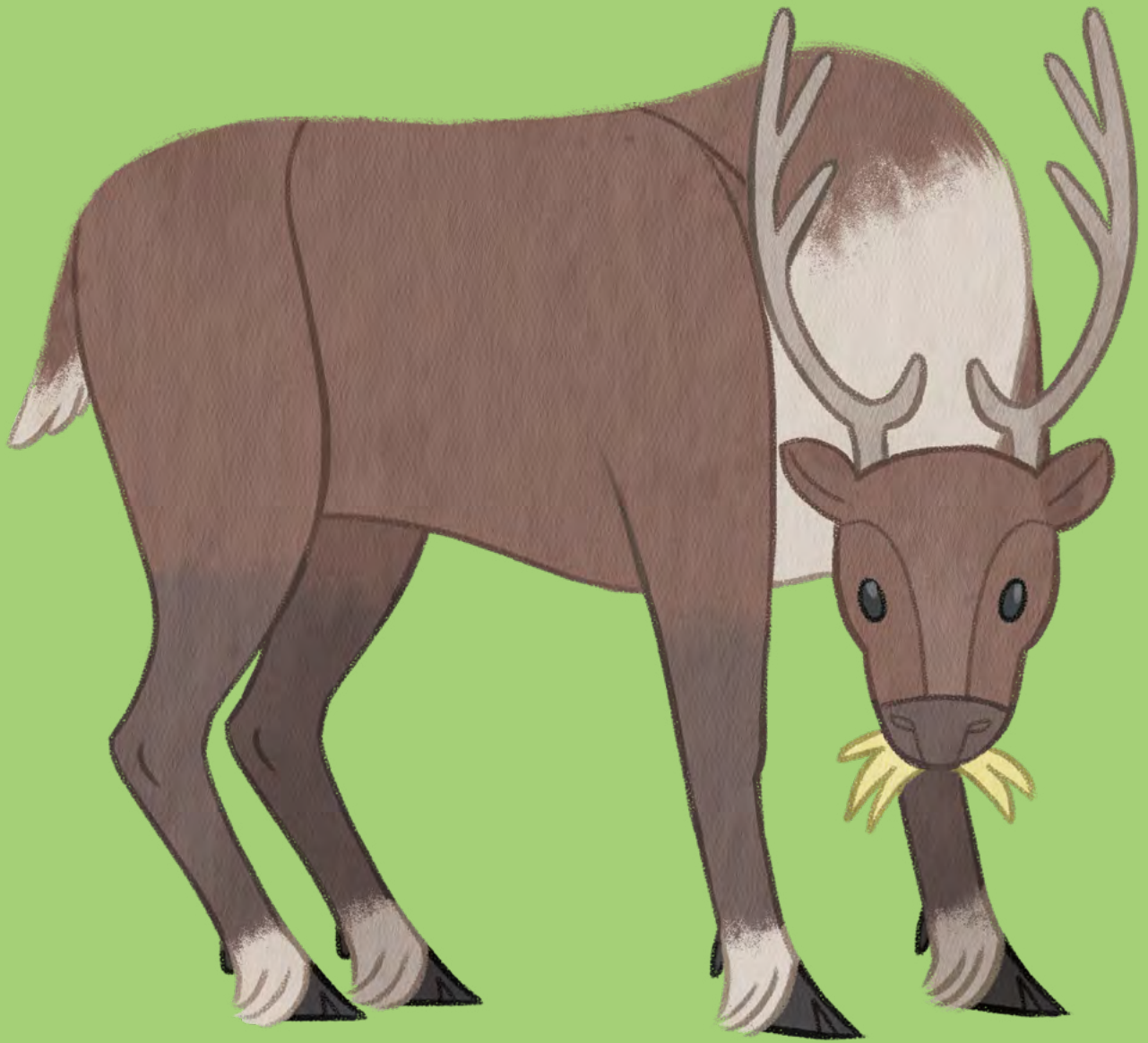

This is a wolf.**







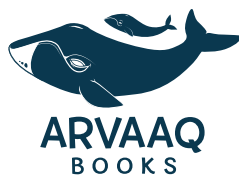
