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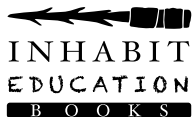

What is going on? These monsters need to learn to share!

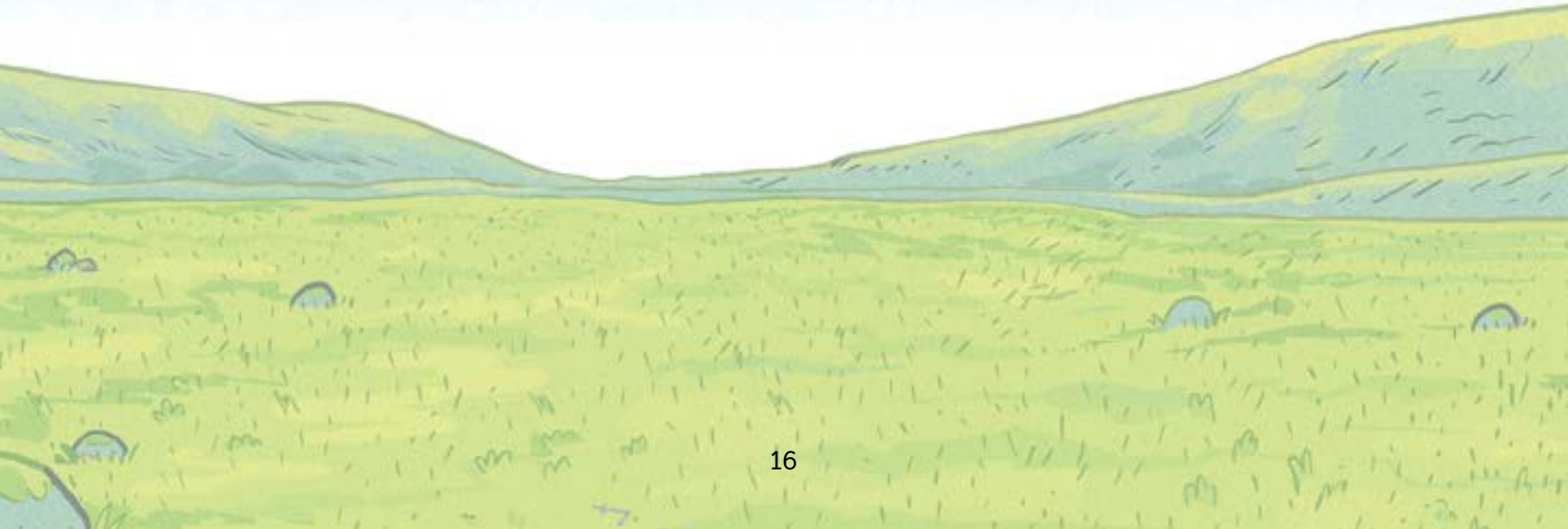
Mia had an idea!

Mia and the monsters spent the whole afternoon eating food and telling stories. It was a really fun day.

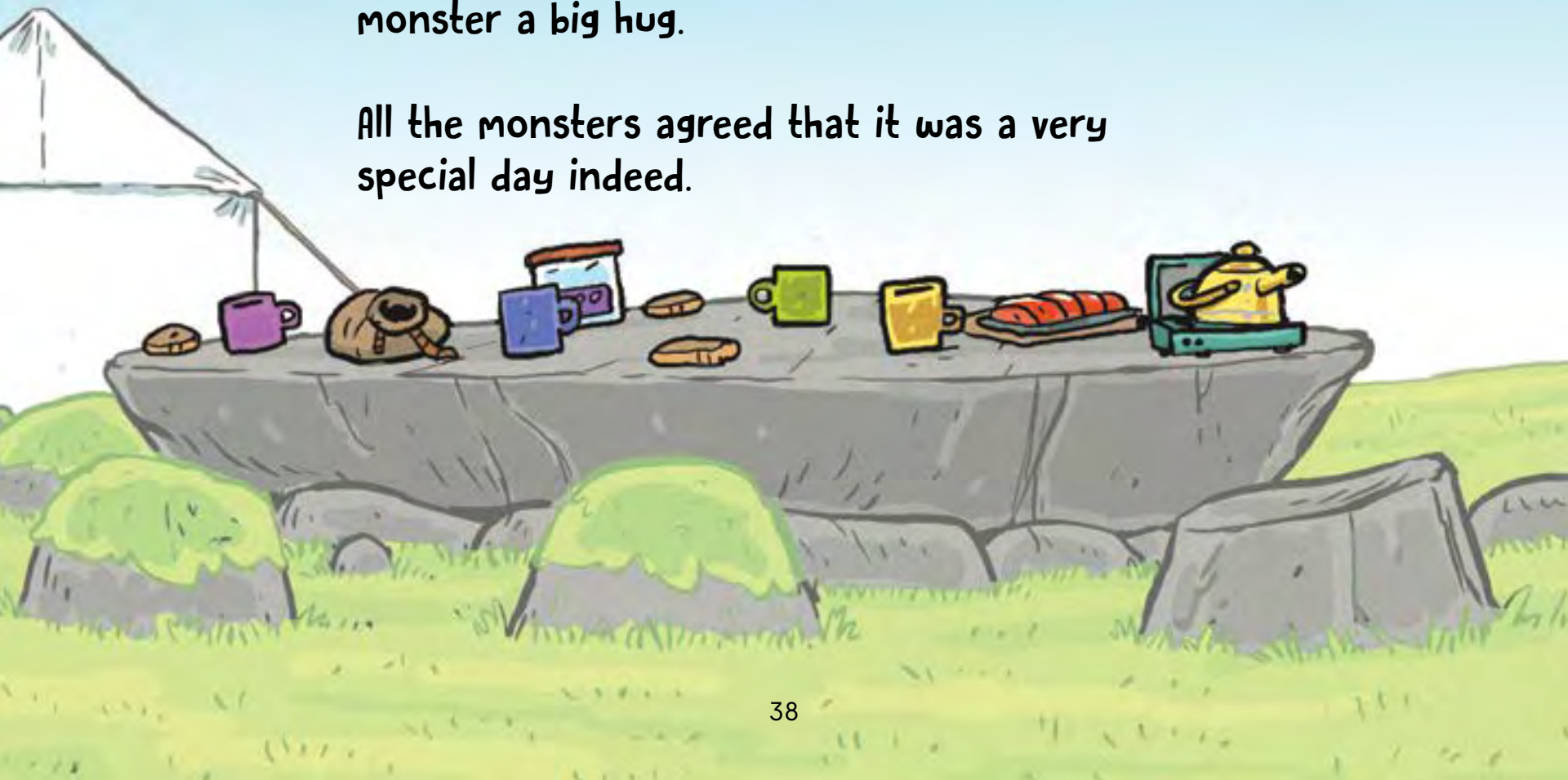


When it was time to go home, Mia stood up on a rock to speak to the monsters.

ACTIVITIES FOR PARENTS AND TEACHERS

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Asking questions encourages young children to think about the story. Here are a few questions you might want to ask children during or after reading *The Monsters Learn to Share*:

- Why don't the monsters want to share?
- Have you ever felt like the monsters?
- Is there something you do not like to share?
- What lesson did the monsters learn?
- Why is it important to share?
- How do you feel when somebody shares something with you?

PLAN A PICNIC

Help your child plan a picnic (indoors or outdoors) to invite their siblings or friends to.

Here are some ideas for planning and preparing for the picnic:

- Plan a menu for the picnic. Your child can draw the food and drink items that will be served. Encourage your child to include some of the things Mia and the monsters had at their picnic!
- Make invitations for the picnic to give out to siblings or friends.
- Prepare the food and drink items together.
- Lay out a blanket and set up for the picnic.
- Talk together about the importance of sharing food. Remind your child how happy the monsters were after they shared their food.
- When the guests arrive, encourage your child to serve the food.
- Enjoy the picnic together!

THE MONSTERS LEARN TO SHARE MATCHING GAME

This game will challenge your child to remember what each monster brought to the picnic. There are two ways to play the game. Choose the option that best fits your child.

Directions

1. Download and print *The Monsters Learn to Share Matching Game* from the Arvaaq Books website (www.arvaaqbooks.com).
2. Have your child cut out the cards. (Assist as needed.)
3. Use the cards to play a matching game:

Option 1: Lay all the monster cards face up in a row. Then, give your child a card with a food or drink item. Have the child match it to the monster who brought it to the picnic. Help the child look back in the book to check that the items were matched correctly.

Option 2: Lay out all the cards (monsters and food items) face down in two rows of four. Invite your child to flip over two of the cards, attempting to find both a monster and the food item that monster brought to the picnic. If it is a match, the child can keep the cards. If it is not a match, have the child flip over the cards. Take turns with your child, flipping over two cards at a time until all the monsters have been matched with the food or drink item they brought to the picnic.

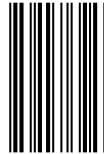
